Over half of Pathways High Seniors elect to participate in an optional 5th IMPACT Year, a supported launch to adulthood, where students pursue dual enrollment college coursework and/or an internship. The 5th year improves students' post-secondary outcomes but negatively affects reported graduation rates. Students create and publicly exhibit real-world products as evidence of authentic learning.

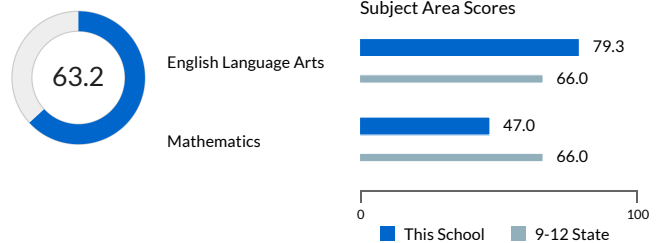

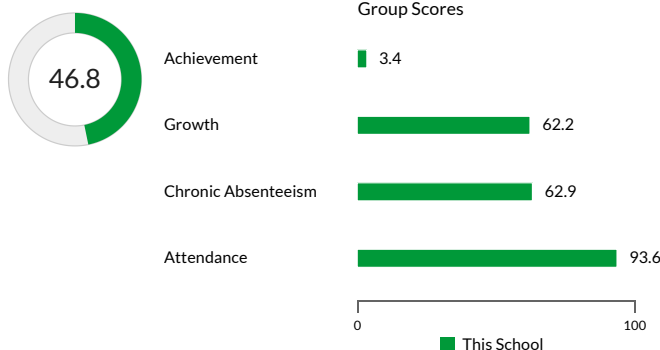

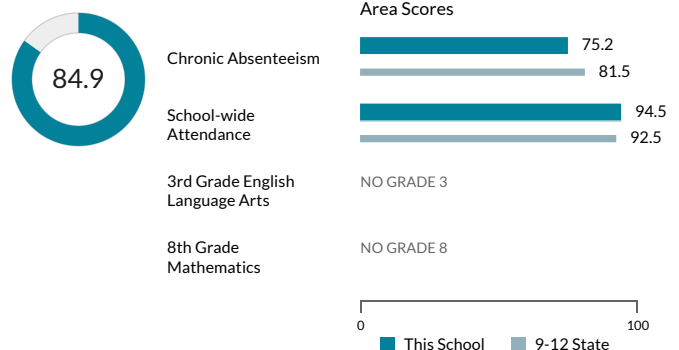

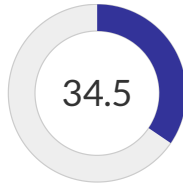




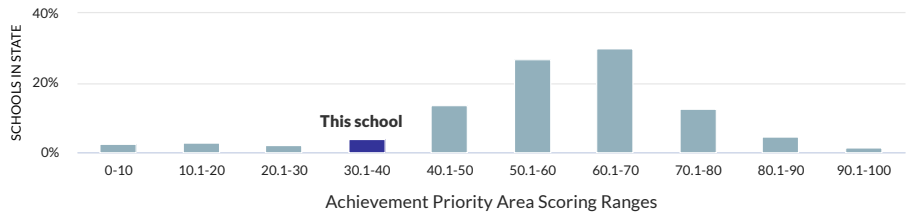
ACHIEVEMENT

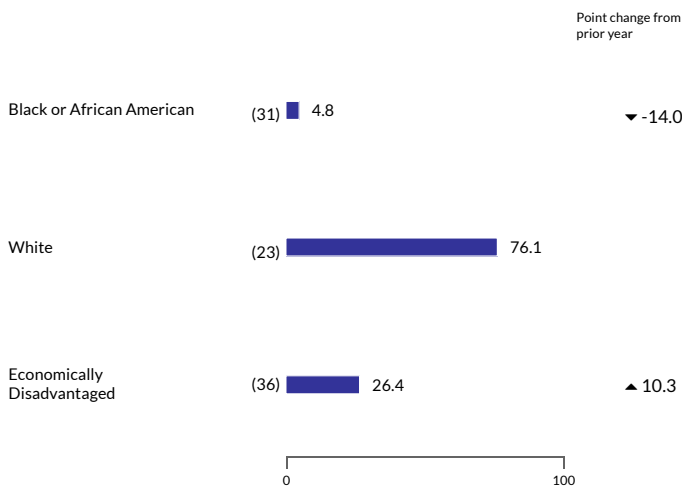

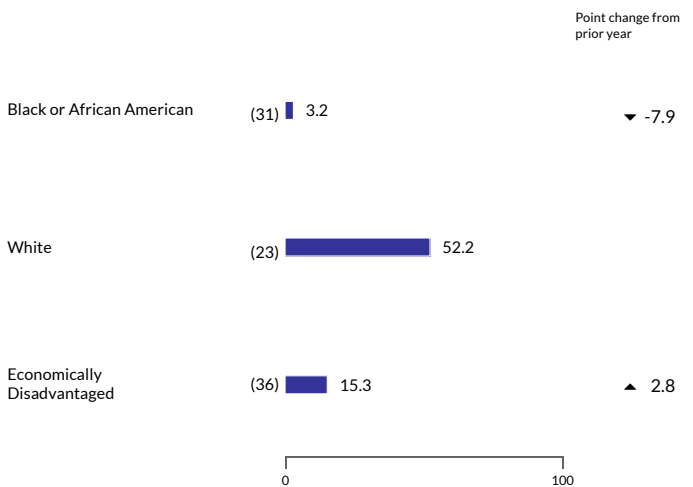

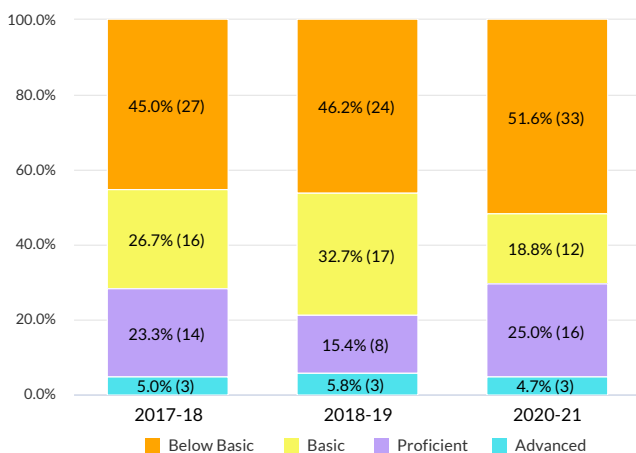

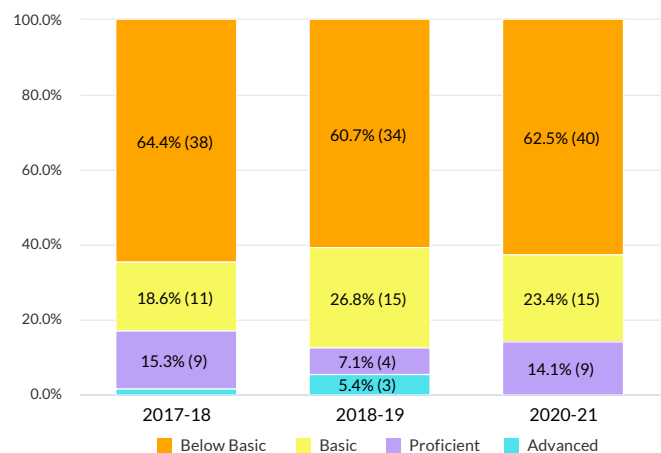
Performance Levels by Year

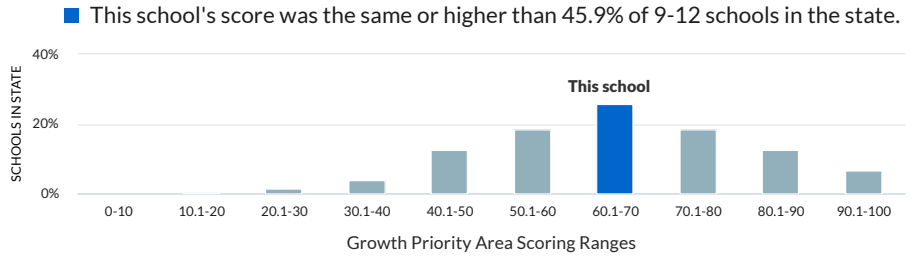
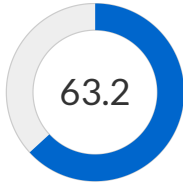

GROWTH

This priority area measures year-to-year student progress on statewide tests. It uses a value-added model that seeks to control for circumstances beyond the influence of educators. A high value-added score means that on average students in the school are progressing more quickly than other, similar students. Growth is scored from 0 to 100 to match the other priority areas and is a conversion from the roughly 0 to 6 value-added score.

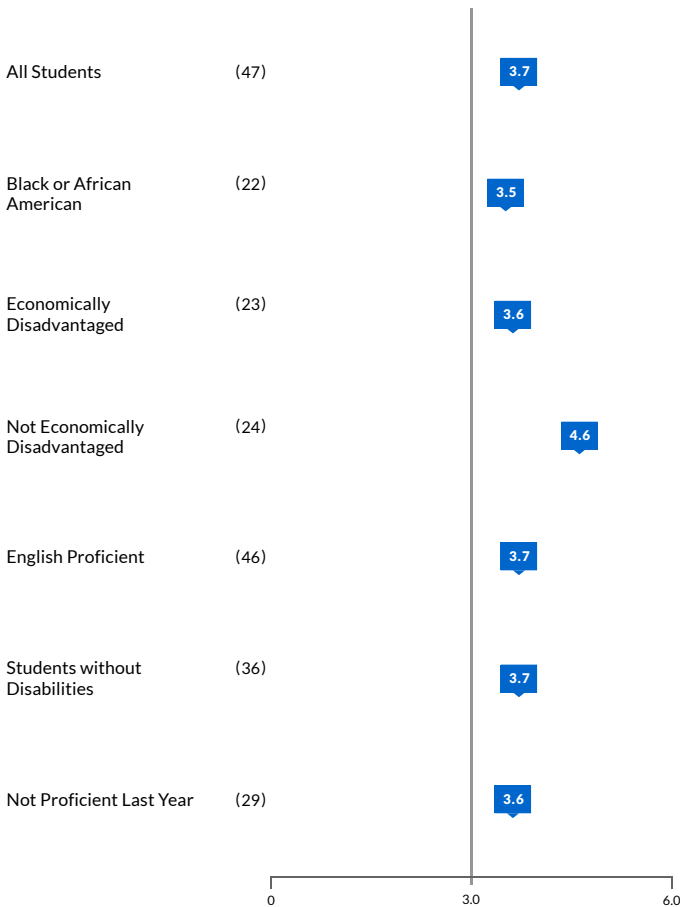

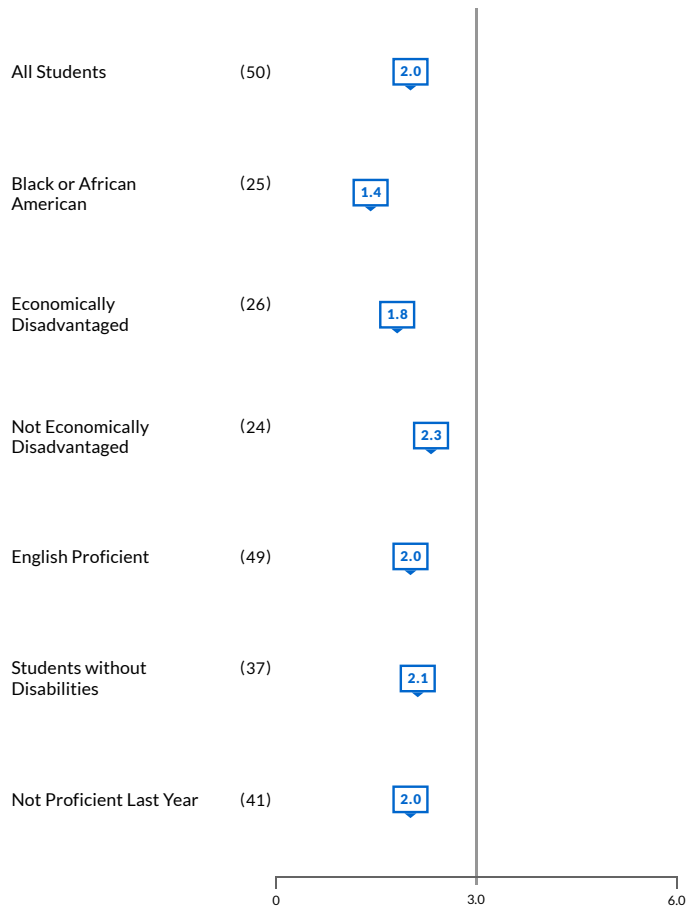

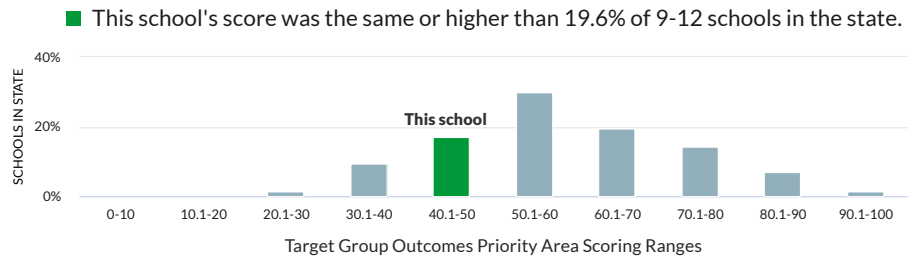
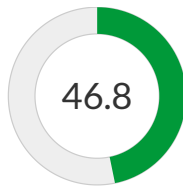




TARGET GROUP OUTCOMES

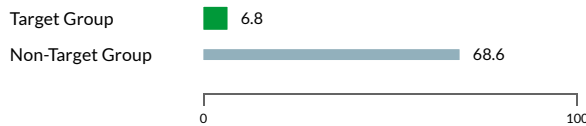

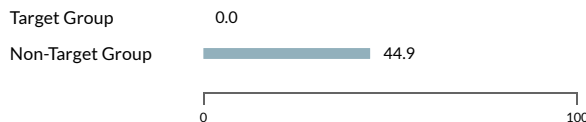

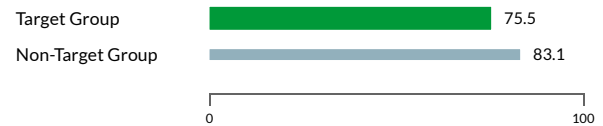

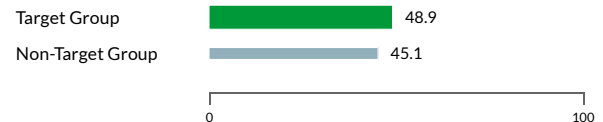

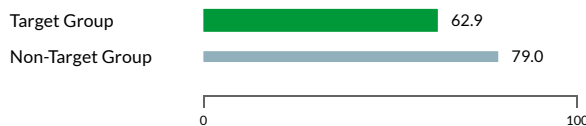

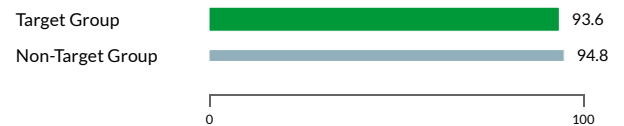

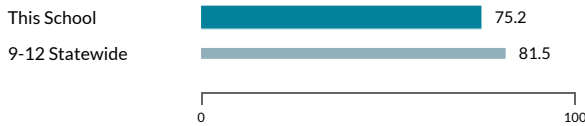

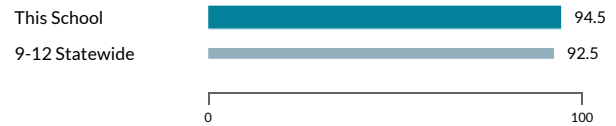

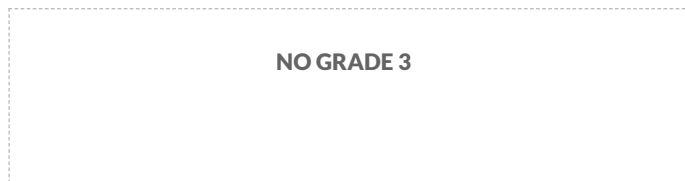

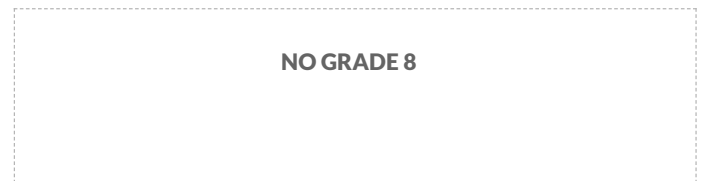
