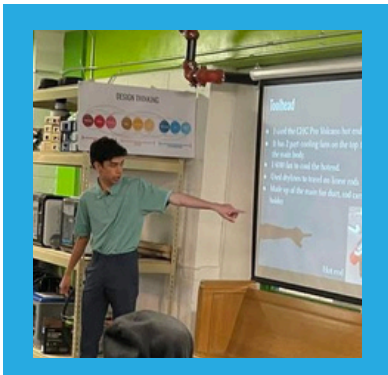

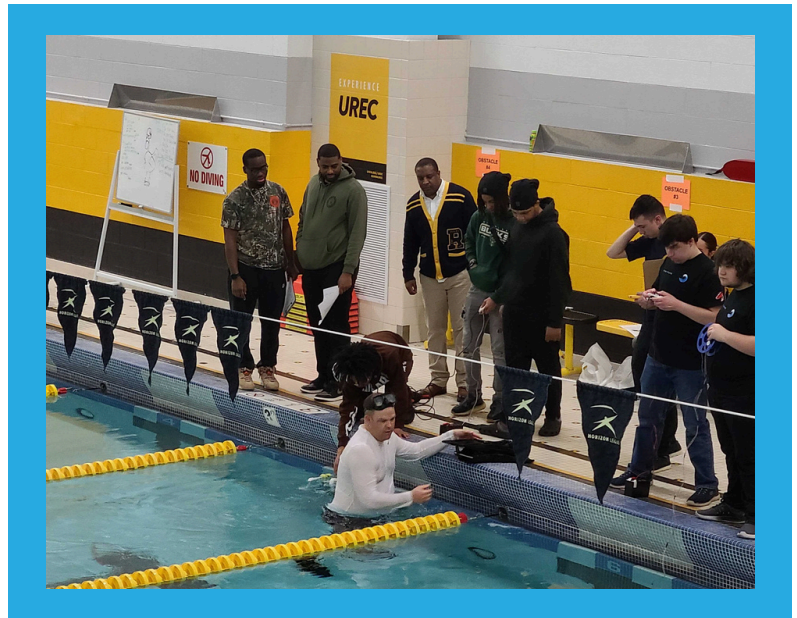

They only got a basic kit of supplies and got to choose few additional parts to design, build, and operate underwater ROVs to tackle challenging missions. Each team had to do three things: earn points in a mission course, move through rings in an obstacle course, and give a presentation to professional engineers. Not only did they get hands-on science and math education, they worked through iterations, problem solved in teams, and got feedback from professionals.
